## ELIGIBILITY AND DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

**Class Structure.** A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

**Progression.** Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be Agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

**Points Progression.** At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant point's scheme (Regulation K3.c refers) except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade. Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed

## STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and point's progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

### Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

### Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

### Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

### Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

### Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

### Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

### Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not jumping classes)

### Lower Height Option.

Societies may offer the Lower Height Option to all dogs in that height category and may be offered at all grades. It is to be run as part of any Standard class as defined in the regulations and must be clearly identified in the schedule. Each relevant class will have two heights with a change part way through to raise/lower the jump heights and competitors must run at their entered height. The order in which the heights will run must be detailed on the ring cards/ring plan. There will be only one course walking at the start of the class. In a class where the Lower Height Option is available show organisers may offer one set of awards by combining the results of each height or may offer separate awards for each height category.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins. Hurdles may be raised/lowered during the course walking time if multiple heights are offered within the same class.

When the Lower Height Option is scheduled a dog may only be entered at either the Full Height or the Lower Height and it cannot compete at a different height in any other class at that competition, including special classes. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule.

## **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS**

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

## **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries - Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

## **KC RULES & REGULATIONS**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
  2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
  3. Entry fees: - £3.30 per dog per class, Champ £12 per dog, YKC Team £15.75 & TAG Team £12.60 working NDDAC members £1 per standard class & £6 Champ class.
  4. All entries to be made via [www.firstplaceprocessing.co.uk](http://www.firstplaceprocessing.co.uk) or Show processor "Longhedge Show Processing"
  5. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries
  6. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
  7. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
  8. Not for Competition - entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
  9. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
  10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
  11. A dog must not compete more than once in a class, including special classes.
  12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
  13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
  14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
  15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
  16. Class 5 is sponsored by First Place Processing, Class 8 is sponsored by Pawstrading, Classes 12 & 20 are sponsored by Agria, Classes 13 & 20 are sponsored by ShowOffs Rosettes, Class 59 is sponsored by TAG & Norton Rosettes, Class 41 is sponsored by First Contact, Class 49 is sponsored by THE Kennel Club & Skinners, Class 58 is sponsored by The Animal Health Company, Class 27 & 28 are sponsored by The YKC and Class 29 by Anthony Clarke (Agility for Juniors)
  17. Kennel Club Standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
  18. Special all sorts classes. Hurdles will be set at Medium height Small height and Micro height, a lower A-frame set at 1.33m to apex.
  19. Height limit for dogs.
    - a. Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
    - b. Medium Dogs – For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm 1ft 5 ins) or under at withers.
    - c. Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
  20. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
  21. Removal of dogs from Competition.
- Following discussion between show management and/or a veterinary surgeon a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-
- a. A bitch which is in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- The circumstances of such removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
22. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show
  23. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (14<sup>th</sup> Aug 2018). For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (25<sup>th</sup> Aug 2018). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
  24. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
  25. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, NDDAC will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date by the competitor. Any refunds will be made within 3 months of the show date.

26. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand or while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
27. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
28. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
29. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
30. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
31. Animals in Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
32. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
33. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
34. Welfare or Dogs An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
35. All dogs are entered at their owner's risk & whilst every care will be taken, the North Derbyshire Dog Agility Club will not take responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to dogs, people or property whilst at this show.
36. All camping units must be equipped with their own firefighting equipment.
37. Parents are responsible for the behaviour of their children at all times whilst on the show venue. No bikes near the ring
38. All generators are to be switched off at 8.30pm each evening.
39. NO CAMP FIRES & no disposable barbecues are to be placed on the grass. Please be careful when you dispose of your barbecue waste & DO NOT put hot disposable barbecues in the skip.
40. Only three dogs per handler off the lead at any time. Competitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Those failing to do so will be asked to leave the show



## THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA MEDIUM DOG AGILITY STAKES

*Supported by Skinner's*

This competition will be classified as Medium Dog combined Grades 3 to 7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-Final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-Final will qualify for the Olympia Grand Final. Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-Final/Final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-Final/Final.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semi-Final at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival held annually in August, the first 10 dogs from this Semi-Final will qualify for the Final at the London Olympia Christmas International Horse Show (subject to the above).

Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competition are those measuring over 350 mm (1 foot 1¾ inches) and those measuring 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) or under at the withers.

## YKC Team Agility Crufts 2019 Qualifier

Effective from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018

The competition is open to all YKC members only, aged 6 years and up to, but not including 18<sup>th</sup> birthday handling any Kennel Club registered dog. One member of the team may be aged between 18 and up to, but not including, 25 years.

A team must consist of 5 unique members with 5 unique dogs (1 dog per handler). A team may have 2 unique reserve members and 2 unique reserve dogs (1 dog per handler). The team may include dogs from any of the three size classifications (e.g. Large, Medium or Small). Please note, make sure you calculate your age as the age you will be on the **first day of CRUFTS**.

The five dogs will be individually timed (not relay) and the combined score/time of the best four in the team will decide the results. Elimination will incur 100 faults – scoring will continue. In the event of only one team entering a heat, the team will run in the heat and providing no more than two dogs are eliminated, the team will qualify. Teams that have previously qualified cannot enter further heats for competition. All team members must ensure that their fees to the Young Kennel Club (YKC) are up to date and fully paid in order to enter any Young Kennel Club class. If you enter a Crufts qualifier and you have not previously paid your membership fee then any award will not count towards qualification for Crufts.

## YKC Under 18 Years Jumping Crufts 2019 Qualifier

Effective from 1st January 2018

The competition is open to all YKC members only, aged 6 years and up to, but not including 18th birthday handling any Kennel Club registered dog.

There are six classes divided by age of member and size of dog as listed below: Under 12 (Handlers 6 years and up to, but not including 12th birthday)

Large Dogs

Medium Dogs

Small Dogs

12 and Over (Handlers 12 years and up to, but not including 18th birthday)

Large Dogs

Medium Dogs

Small Dogs

Please enter the class age category you will be on the day of the qualifier. If you should move into the next age range after you have already qualified, the YKC will invite you into the correct age group at Crufts.

The YKC method for Crufts qualification is a points based system as follows:

1st Place = 30 points;

2nd Place = 15 points;

3rd Place = 10 points.

If a member and dog combination accumulate 30 points or more, they will qualify for Crufts. If a member gains 30 or more points with multiple dogs, they may only compete with one dog at Crufts, but they will have the option to choose from any of the dogs they have 30 or more points with. All points are reset to 0 on 1st January each year.

Members must ensure that their fees to the Young Kennel Club (YKC) are up to date and fully paid in order to enter any Young Kennel Club class. If you enter a Crufts qualifier and you have not previously paid your membership fee then any award will not count towards qualification for Crufts. Proof of membership fee payment will be required in order for an award to be accepted and confirmed as a Crufts qualification.



## Agility For Juniors Speed Jump Off



### General Rules

Open to all handlers who are UNDER 21 years of age on the 22nd October 2018

Separate classes for Small /Medium /Large

Speed Jump off class will consist of ONLY Jumps and tunnels.

Course level should be Grade 5, but fast and flowing

Any handler under 21 years old on the 22nd of October 2018 may take part in the Agility for Juniors Speed Jump off qualification heat. This class will be split into small, medium and large. The fastest dog with the least amount of course faults will win the height class. The top 2 dogs of each height class will qualify for the Agility for Juniors Speed Jump off Final to be held on the weekend of the 13th & 14th October 2018 at the British Agility Championships.

### Final Qualification

Agility for juniors will host 5 Qualification heats from the 1st of January 2018 - 1st October 2018

Top 2 from each height category will qualify for the Final

Agility For Juniors Speed Jump Off Final 2018 -

The top two dogs and handlers from each height class will be invited to take part in the British Junior Agility Championships final, where all jump heights will compete against each other with a prize pot of £150 to be split between the winners.

The final will be held at the British Agility Championships on the weekend of the 13th & 14th October 2018



**Agria Brillo Bounce**



**Agria Brillo Bounce Rules 2018**

Two Dog Agility competitions; one for Small Dogs Grades 1 –7 and one for Medium Dogs Grades 1 –7.

Agria Brillo Bounce classes must be judged using current Kennel Club rules at standard heights and each host venue may choose which grades are included for each qualifier.

Class Titles:

Agria Brillo Bounce Small Dog Qualifier

Agria Brillo Bounce Medium Dog Qualifier

Class Style:

The class must be standard agility or jumping class. Each heat must be open to a minimum of at least two different grades eg. 1- 3 or 4 - 5 combined. (Preference for at least 3 grades please)

Qualifiers: Each host venue provides 5 qualifiers at each size of dog to take to the final.

Final: Each Final will consist of 2 rounds (1 Agility and 1 Jumping) at each size which will not be timed

(max time specified) and all double clears will go towards the final round. In the event of less than 10 double clears at either size then all double clears and dogs with the minimum combined faults will be selected to produce 10 dogs for the final round. Time will be used with faulted dogs to determine those chosen up to 10 dogs. The 10 dogs will compete in the final jumping round against the clock to find winners and enjoy a share of the prize money at each size.

There are 10 heats for each size of dog at different grades held at shows around the country with the top 5 of each size of qualifier being invited to the Agria Brillo Bounce Finals at British Agility Championships in the autumn of 2018. Further details to be announced.

## The Animal Health Company Classic Competition Rules 2018



A Dog Agility competition for small, medium and large dogs 3 – 6  
combined grades

using a Steeplechase style course. The class must be judged using current Kennel  
Club rules and a course must feature the Westcotts Water Jump.

- 1. Jump heights will be set at 650mm standard height only for the qualifier.**
2. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
3. *If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.*
4. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.

6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 6.

10. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
11. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a final due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.

## TAG Team Dash sponsored by TAG & Norton Rosettes



*The TAG Team Dash is a competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple jumping course. It is designed as a flowing sprint event with spectator appeal; accessible to all grades of handlers and all heights of dogs plus LHO for Large. Teams of four large, four LHO Large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions.*

*There are ten qualifying heats. The top two teams from each heat, regardless of height, qualify for a final comprising of twenty teams at the TAG July Summer show.*

*It is a requirement of this competition that the course contains few (if any) traps, and is of 'fast and flowing style'. A simple course such as a figure of eight, or a largely circular or helter-skelter style course is most appropriate.*

1. The competition is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as Combined Grades 1 to 7 and Special, and will be held under KC Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional rules apply as described below. Competitors entering this competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.
2. All dogs entered in the team (including reserves) MUST be entered in the show in at least 1 normal height class (i.e. not veterans or anysize).
3. All teams must consist of four dogs of the same height classification, handled by four separate handlers. All teams will compete over the same course at the appropriate height of the team of dogs competing. The heights are Large, LH Large Medium And Small.
4. Substitute dogs for teams are permitted, provided that (i) the dog(s) is/are already entered in the show, (ii) the dog(s) is/are not already entered in another team in this heat and (iii) alterations are made before the run and recorded on the scribe sheet.
5. Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat. Should one dog be entered in more than one qualifying team across the heats then the first team to have qualified will go through to the final and any subsequent teams will not be eligible (this DOES NOT apply to handlers).
6. The course must contain two changeover lines, clearly marked with start/finish poles, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. (Handler 1 may use a recall start). The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
7. The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no less than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles.
8. This is a relay event and two suitable batons must be provided. All baton changes must be completed with the handlers and dogs behind the appropriate changeover line. Failure to comply with this, or an incorrect baton change (i.e. throwing or dropping the baton at changeover) will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. Stewards may be appointed by the judge to adjudicate changeovers if required.
9. For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a single penalty of 100 points, however the judge will continue to mark any further faults on the remainder of the course and the faults of any remaining dogs.
10. The team with the fastest time and the least faults, wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final (unless the heat is split – see rule 11).
11. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat.
12. Only the members of an original qualifying team (as specified on the scribe sheet at the time of the run) or the two original named reserves, will be allowed to compete in the final.
13. In the event of a team being unavailable for the final, a reserve team will be called from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.

Individual trophies and rosettes will be provided for 1st and 2nd placed teams and individual rosettes will be provided for 3rd to 6th placed teams (in the event of a split heat, trophies will go to 1st and rosettes to 3rd for each part)

#### From A1 (north & south)

Exit at the junction with the A46 – follow the A46 in the direction Leicester / Nottingham / Mansfield (A617) At the roundabout at the end of the bypass take the third exit (Mansfield A617), follow the road until the first set of traffic lights and turn left– direction Staythorpe power station / Rolleston – continue on this road for approx 2 miles and turn right into Station Road in Rolleston (signed Rolleston Station) follow the road for approx 0.4 of a mile and turn left immediately after the level crossing (warning there is limited vision of the road you are crossing) – this route is fine for cars / small caravans however, if you have a large rig, instead of turning right, follow the racecourse signs into Fiskerton, taking a right where indicated and turning right again onto Occupation Lane just after the rail crossing & the racecourse entrance is approximately 1 mile ahead.

#### From the M1 (north & south)

If traveling from the north, if possible try and join the A1 asap, as much quicker from Newark.
